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❖ World Aids Day : 01.12.2025



## World AIDS Day Awareness Programme

World AIDS Day was observed with great enthusiasm and social commitment on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2025 at Government College for Women (A), Srikakulam, with the objective of creating awareness among students and the general public about HIV/AIDS prevention, care, and the

importance of empathy towards people living with HIV/AIDS. As part of the awareness programme, a rally was organized by the NSS volunteers along with the teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. The rally commenced from the college campus and proceeded up to Surya Mahal Junction, carrying placards and raising awareness slogans highlighting the need for prevention, early diagnosis, and the elimination of stigma associated with HIV/AIDS.

## ❖ Invited Talk on “ Quantum Revolution From Physics to Technology : 23.12.25


