

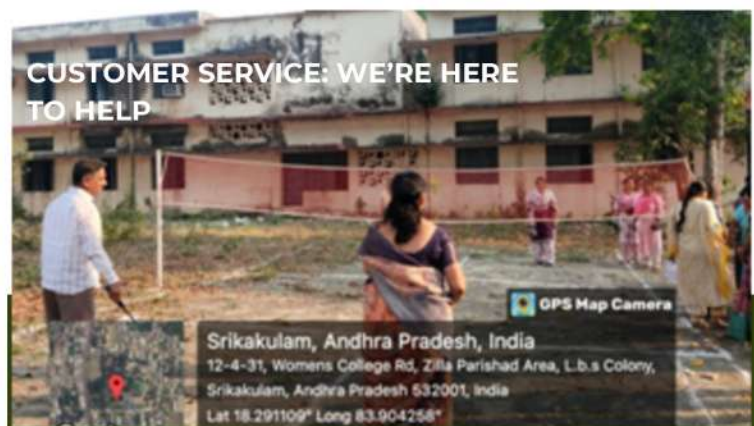

For the past week, the Government Women's College Jawahar Knowledge Center and the Computer Science and Computer Application Department have been organizing a soft skills and employability skills program as part of the Student Skill Development Program in collaboration with the Andhra Pradesh Information Technology Academy.
